  - A. 1030 students in the building this year
    - 1. Big adjustment from last year
    - 2. Need to come together and re-acclimate to in person school
  - B. Teacher observations have started
  - C. SLT worked on an updated mission statement for our school
  - D. Students took part in IREADY diagnostics to see where the kids are
  - E. Virtual Parent Teacher Conferences coming up

- F. On Thursday and Friday mornings teachers are available to give extra assistance and support to students who are struggling
  - 1. Using IREADY data to identify students who need help
  - 2. 8th grade will use this time for extra regents prep

- A. When will state test scores be available?
  - 1. Test scores were just released and can be found on your NYC Schools account
- B. Can teachers lighten the workload around the TACHS exam?
  - This is not possible because of Regents deadlines. The US History regents are 4
    weeks early this year. Also, not all students are taking the exam. It may be
    possible to give less homework that weekend.
- C. When will HS applications open?
  - 1. We are expecting it to happen very soon but there is no date available yet.
- D. Can anyone take a regents exam?
  - 1. All students are given the opportunity to opt in for regents of their choice in 8th grade.
- E. Where will the SHSAT exam take place?
  - 1. Last year 194 had a record 175-200 students take the SHSAT. The location will be determined by the number of kids registered.
- F. Can students take the regents and the state exams?
  - 1. No. NYC will no longer allow double testing of students. If students take the regents, they cannot take the state exam in that subject.
- G. Will Pass or Fail still be an option this year?
  - 1. Yes
- H. How will clubs work?
  - 1. Clubs will be in-person with limited numbers of kids and will require a parents permission slip
